On Wednesday, March 12, 2014, the Center for International Studies at the University of Missouri-St. Louis, The Japan America Society of St. Louis, the Consulate General of Japan at Chicago, the Chicago office of the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) and the St. Louis Regional Chamber will host the Kizuna Economic Seminar. This event is being presented in commemoration of the 3rd Anniversary of The Great East Japan Earthquake and will examine the state of Japan's economic recovery, both at the national level and in the areas affected by the disaster.

On his trip to the United States in late February 2013, Prime Minister Shinzo Abe announced that "I am back and so is Japan." Since then, the well spring of business confidence that has resulted from the Prime Minister's economic policies, commonly known as Abenomics, has been nothing short of phenomenal. In 2013, the Nikkei Stock average rose almost 57%. The growth rate of Japan's real GDP during the second quarter of 2013 was 3.6%, the highest of the G8 countries with the current forecast for the first three months of 2014 at 4.4%. Importantly, Japan's unemployment rate during November 2013 was 4.0%, the lowest among the G8. As a result of Prime Minister Abe's leadership, there is a renewed sense of optimism in Japan.

The Kizuna Economic Seminar will feature Opening Remarks by Masaharu Yoshida, Consul General of Japan at Chicago which will be followed by a presentation from Ichiro Soné, Chief Executive Director of the Chicago office of the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO). As the official economic development agency of the Japanese government, JETRO promotes trade & investment between Japan and the rest of the world. Mr. Soné will provide an update on the progress of Abenomics, the economic reform measures put forth by Prime Minister Shinzo Abe. Mr. Soné will also speak about the structural changes the Japan economy will soon undertake which are key to the success of Abenomics. These include advancing the role of women in the workforce, liberalizing the electricity market, increasing the deployment of solar and thermal power generation, commercializing advances in regenerative medicine and the importance of assisting foreign companies to expand and grow their presence in Japan.

Following Mr. Soné will be Akiko Nakagawa, Director-General of the Trade Fair Department at JETRO Tokyo. Ms. Nakagawa is a native of Fukushima, one of the prefectures hardest hit by The Great East Japan Earthquake. At the time of the disaster, she was working at JETRO's office in Sendai, Miyagi Prefecture, the largest city in the Tohoku region. Ms. Nakagawa will share her personal account of the disaster and the effect it had on the region's people and economy. She will also talk about the progress of the recovery in the Tohoku area and the challenges faced by local industries, especially the manufacturing, agriculture and fishing sectors.

This event will be held in Room 202 of the J.C. Penney Conference Center, at the University of Missouri–St. Louis. Registration will begin at 4:30 PM, with the program scheduled for 5:00–7:00 PM. Participation is free but advance registration is requested. A parking permit is required for all visitors to the UMSL campus. Masaharu Yoshida

Consul General, Consulate General of Japan at Chicago
