End of Summer *Matsuri* at Japan House and the gardens Sunday, August 30, 2015 3:00 – 7:00 pm

The End of Summer *Matsuri* will be a one-day festival to be held on the grounds of the University of Illinois College of Fine and Applied Arts Japan House and the Arboretum. It will act as a celebratory kick-off to the fall 2015 semester at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Matsuri is the Japanese word for festival and it will indeed be a festival of Japanese culture, food, and drink! Visiting artists will include Ho Etsu Taiko, a powerful drumming group from Chicago, Masaji Terasawa a renowned Japanese children's performer who executes Amezaiku (Japanese candy artistry), demonstrations of Japanese martial arts such as Aikido, Kendo and Karate, the making of traditional pottery tea bowls, outdoor tea ceremonies by the Urbana-Champaign Association of Chado Urasenke Tankokai, demonstrations and displays of Ikebana and Bonsai, garden tours, a cosplay and yukata fashion show and demonstrations of Japanese dance and other Asian cultural performances.

Throughout the afternoon there will be vendors selling Japanese and other Asian inspired food and drink and goods. There is a focus on not just Japanese and Asian food, but local food and drink that is influenced by these cultures. Tents will be set up in the Arboretum and grounds surrounding Japan House and its ponds and gardens. Purchase of bracelets and food tickets are needed to buy food, drinks and to view demonstrations within Japan House. Tickets and bracelets will be available online at **japanhouse.art.illinois.edu** in early August. All outdoor performances (music, dance, martial arts, fashion, etc.) will be open and free to all. This event will be marketed to UIUC students, both domestic and international, as well as to the general public.

Our vision for this event has further developed into supporting and celebrating other vendors and similar organizations in our community and within the University that also strive to embrace and elevate the importance of diversity, culture, and taste. Connecting with like-minded businesses and organizations was an underlining hope for this event.
