

Japanese Direct Investment in Iowa (as of October 1, 2024)









- The City of Des Moines has the highest number of Japanese business facilities (6) and the highest level of employment (1,621) as of October 2024.





Japanese Trade with Iowa (as of February, 2025)




Japanese trade with Iowa contributes significantly to the state economy.

- The leading imports from Japan are Machinery (non-electrical) and Transportation Equipment.


Iowa Exports (2024)

Breakdown by Trade Partner




Iowa Imports (2024)


Breakdown by Trade Partner



Exports to Japan by Sector




Imports from Japan by Sector




<u>Highlighted Iowa Exports to Japan: Prepared Meats and Aluminum</u>

Prepared Meat¹ Export Trend (2020-2024)



Japan is Iowa's largest market for prepared meat. Prepared meat exports have grown significantly over the last five years increasing more than 630% from around \$18 million in 2020 to over \$133 million in 2024.

Aluminum Articles² Export Trend (2020-2024)



Japan is Iowa's largest market for aluminum exports. Aluminum exports have grown dramatically in recent years increasing almost 4,600% from around \$1.4 million in 2021 to more than \$65 million in 2024.
