

Japanese Direct Investment in Wisconsin (as of October 1, 2024)













- The leading imports from Japan are Machinery (non-electrical) and Chemicals.










Imports from Japan by Sector



<u>Highlighted Wisconsin Exports to Japan: Sausages and Computers</u>



Japan is Wisconsin's 2nd largest market for sausage exports. Sausage exports have grown steadily over the last 3 years increasing more than 20% from around \$27 million in 2022 to more than \$33 million in 2024.



Computer exports have grown significantly over the last five years increasing 75% from around \$27 million in 2020 to almost \$48 million in 2024.
