<u>Japanese Business Facilities and Their Employment</u> Reach New Record Levels in 10 Midwest States in 2017

The 2017 survey of Japanese direct investment in 10 Midwest states*, conducted by the Consulate-General of Japan in Chicago, is based upon data as of October 1, 2017. The results are as follows:

Highlights

Website:

- In 2017, 1,411 Japanese business facilities in the Midwest provided 150,850 jobs, which increased by 2.6% and by 8.2% respectively, setting new records. This continues the strong upward trend in the last 5 years with 15% more business facilities and 38% more total employment.
- In Illinois, the 46,490 jobs provided by 631 Japan business facilities saw a significant 6.1% increase. The nearly 2,700 new jobs were mainly in the motor vehicle and food sectors.
- In Indiana, more than 7,000 new jobs were created primarily in the motor vehicle sector for a remarkable 12.1% jump to 65,220 positions. The number of Japanese business facilities grew by 16 to 296 for a 5.7% gain.




Business Facility Number

In 2017, Illinois ranked first in Japanese business facilities with 45%, followed by Indiana with 21%.




Total Employment

In 2017, Indiana ranked first in total employment with 43% followed by Illinois with 31%.



Actual Manufacturing Employment

In 2017, the 351 actual manufacturers* accounted for 25% of the total business facilities. They provided 74,090 high-skilled, high-paying jobs, or 49% of the total employment.




Share By Sector

Overall manufacturing continued to be the leading sector with 65% of the business facilities and 87% of the total employment. In manufacturing, the motor vehicles and parts sector accounted for 14% of the total business facilities and 44% of the total employment.
