Although I did not know him personally, I have heard much about his achievements as the longest serving Governor of the State of Illinois, Chairman of Winston & Strawn, and as Chairman of the Midwest U.S.-Japan Association.

Few have achieved so much as Governor Thompson did for Japan's close partnership with Illinois and the Midwest. His eight trade and investment missions to Japan, the most by any governor at the time.
