## Garden of the Phoenix We all know that Jackson Park.

located on the South Side of Chicago, is beautiful all year round! But, did you know about the Garden of the Phoenix – located inside the park where you can view breathtaking sakura or cherry blossom trees every spring? The Garden of the Phoenix emanates from the site of the Ho-o-den (Phoenix Pavilion), which was dedicated on the Wooded Island by the Government of Japan for the World's Columbian Exposition in 1893, as a permanent place for visitors to learn about Japan and experience Japanese culture. Since then, with the good will and dedication of the American people, it has been maintained as a symbol of friendship between Japan and U.S.

#### **Cherry Blossom Trees**

The Japanese government and the city of Osaka, a sister city of Chicago since 1973, have supported the further development of The Garden of the Phoenix and have cooperated in its development.

In 2013, over 120 cherry blossom trees were planted to commemorate the Garden's 120-year anniversary of the site and to celebrate the peaceful relationship between the United States and Japan. Between 2013-2016, an additional 50 cherry blossom trees were planted with the support of JCCC (Japanese Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Chicago). As they grow in size and number, the trees inspire new opportunities for cultural exchange and learning for generations to come.

Hanami, or flower-viewing, is a Japanese springtime tradition that occurs every year when the sakura bloom. During this time, friends and family gather under the trees to enjoy viewing the exquisite flowers and trees while enjoying seasonal bento, or meal-in-a-box, to celebrate the transient beauty of flowers, and the coming of the season after a long winter.

While this year's full bloom of sakura at the Garden of the Phoenix has already passed, there is always next year. To look forward to the season to come and to find joy in the different seasons at the Garden of the Phoenix, the Consulate-General of Japan in Chicago would like to invite you to a virtual visit to the Garden of the Phoenix to learn about the Garden with educational resources like stories and images.
